April 24, 2024

The Wheeler County Commissioners met for the regular monthly meeting on this date. Legal Notice of the meetings was published in the April 17, 2024, editions of the Burwell Tribune and Official Agenda posted according to law. Chairman Heinz called the meeting to order and identified the location of the Nebraska Open Meetings Act poster on the Court Room West wall. Answering roll call were Commissioners Heinz, Plugge and Pokorny. Clerk Snider, Treasurer Seamann, County Attorney Joe McNally, Sheriff King, Deputy Sheriff McQuillan and Road Foreman Reed were also present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Plugge made a motion to approve the March 27, 2024, regular board meeting minutes, seconded by Pokorny. Voting aye: Plugge, Pokorny, and Heinz. Voting nay: none.

Public Comments were heard. Chad Matthews, on behalf of Herd Co., voiced concerns with the weight limit signs that had been placed on 836<sup>th</sup> Road going west of Highway 281. Herd Co will try and get the word out to their truckers to encourage the truckers to use the North Entrance.

Travis Sprout visited with the board about the repairs on the ½ mile of 833<sup>rd</sup> Rd, West of 490<sup>th</sup> Ave. and it was approved at a previous meeting that the county would repair the road shoulders. Pokorny made a motion to rescind the previous motion to repair such road, seconded by Heinz. Voting aye: Pokorny, Heinz, and Plugge. Voting nay: none.

Doug Reiter, Weed Superintendent, reported that he will be starting to spray when signs are showing up of spurge.

There was no update on the upgrade of a maintainer or maintainer storage agreement at this time.

Reed reported he contacted an asphalt repair company from Oklahoma to provide an estimate for repairs on the asphalted portion of 823<sup>rd</sup> Rd/Pibel Road. Reed was also directed to contact Werner Construction, as they are currently in the area, to get an additional bid for repairs.

Reed had one bid for the grader evaluation and was waiting for the other to determine if it can be repaired or traded off.

The Courthouse ceiling spray foam insulation bids were reviewed, and the board will seek further interested bidders.

Sheriff King presented the Sheriff's quarterly report. No action taken.

Treasurer Seamann stated that there is no need to transfer funds this month as the funds were looking good, and that she would be able to pay back \$150,000 from Road Fund back to General Fund.

There was no action taken on the Central Nebraska Economic Development District board appointment at this time.

Zoning Administrator Brandi Pokorny updated the board on zoning topics. Heinz made a motion to give her the authority to seek proposals for updating the Zoning Comp Plan and Ordinances, seconded by Pokorny. Voting aye: Heinz, Pokorny, and Plugge. Voting nay: none.

Brandi Pokorny also reported that Loup Valleys Rural Public Power District has applied for a Conditional Use Permit for a small solar facility and the Planning and Zoning Commission had recommended approval. The board set a public hearing on the application for May 29<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am to be followed by board consideration of approval or denial.

Veteran's Service Officer Ken Stenka gave a quarterly report on what his office has been doing. He is going to try and meet with the board quarterly and then be available for services after the meeting.

Alex Hoepker from The Windmill requested a Special Designated License (SDL) for Mike Ellenwood and Teri Jo Perkins wedding at the Wheeler County Fairgrounds on June 22, 2024. Pokorny made a motion to approve the SDL application, seconded by Plugge. Voting aye: Pokorny, Plugge, and Heinz. Voting nay: none.
